Classroom Policy for Missing Class:

Formative Assessment- Throughout the course, students will engage in regular formative assessments designed to support and guide their learning. These may include exit tickets, short written reflections, low-stakes quizzes, class discussions, source analysis activities, and collaborative projects. The goal of these assessments is to check for understanding, provide timely feedback, and adjust instruction based on student needs.

Summative Assessment- Summative assessments are used to evaluate student learning at the end of a unit, module, or major assignment. These include unit tests, graded quizzes, research projects, essays, and presentations. Each summative assessment is designed to measure students' understanding of historical content, critical thinking, and ability to communicate ideas effectively.

Late Homework- If you turn in late homework your grade will be docked 10% if it is a day late and 20% for 2 days late and beyond. For example, an assignment that you scored a 96% on two days late would receive a grade of 76%.

Retake Quizzes or Test- You can retake any quiz or test, but first you need to review and meet with Mr. Slechta. The highest grade you can get on your retake is 80%.

Academic Dishonesty- Cheating is being dishonest. If you are caught cheating it will automatically be a zero in the gradebook. I will make a phone call home, and you will not be able to redo or retake your work.

Cheating includes:

- * Copying another student's work.
- * Plagiarizing text such as using another person's ideas without giving the original author credit or completely copying an entire work without contributing any original thought.
- * Completely copying material generated by Artificial Intelligence (AI).
