Basic Classroom Routine

Beginning	Sit in your assigned seat - please ask if you need to move Sit down and stop talking when the bell rings
During	Listen (don't talk) when the teacher is instructing Stay seated during instruction, head up Treat teachers and classmates with respect No earbuds/phones
End	30 seconds to clean up Remain seated until the bell rings

Student/Teacher Expectations: Lexington High School's expectations are also my classroom expectations. We follow the rules while under my supervision. We're on the MARCH. We are Mindful, Accountable, Respectful, Compassionate, and Honest.

In my classroom, we treat each other the way we want to be treated. We respect the authority of the teacher, so I can respect the time of the student. We recognize that the amount of fun and freedom we have in our learning environment is dependent on students and teachers following expectations.

GRADING POLICY:

Daily Assignments (30%): sponge, activities worksheets, notes

Projects (30%): smaller writing assignments, multimedia projects

Assessments (40%): quizzes, tests, writing assignments

Late Work: A zero and missing icon will be entered in the gradebook the day after an assignment is due. If students need more time, they may communicate with the teacher in person or via email to make arrangements. If the student does not follow the plan/arrangement, a zero and/or late score (one letter grade per week) will be assigned. Assignments more than two weeks late may not be accepted. ***Large projects/assessments with predetermined due dates may not be accepted late.

Absences: If students are absent, it is their responsibility to get their make-up work. Students should ask the teacher to explain missing work before or after school or during 2nd period, not during class. If a student is absent due to an extracurricular activity, the student must get assignments **BEFORE** they leave for that activity and will adhere to the original due date. According to the LHS Student Handbook, students may have two days to complete assignments if ill.

Cheating and Plagiarism: Cheating and Plagiarism are not allowed on any assignment or assessment. Students are expected to do their own work. Students are not allowed to share documents unless used for a collaborative assignment and instructed by the teacher. Plagiarism includes copying information from the Internet or another student, as well as using your own work from another assignment/class. Students who cheat or commit plagiarism will be given a zero on the assignment or assessment and must meet with teacher and administration regarding a redo according to the LHS handbook.

*Artificial Intelligence (AI): Students who choose to use AI should consider it as a tool. You might look up definitions, explanations, or examples. AI should be used as a starting point - not a final product. Any student who does not abide by this will receive a zero for the assignment.

This is Cheating: submitting your friend's work, submitting an older sibling's work, copying/pasting an article you found online, helping another student cheat, asking AI to do your work for you.

This is not Cheating: asking your teacher (me) for help, asking a parent to help you understand an assignment, using a quote you found online and citing it properly.

There are other examples of Cheating and Academic Dishonesty in the classroom. If it seems like cheating, it probably is. The LHS Handbook outlines specific consequences for Cheating. In my classroom, students will receive No Credit for work that is not their own and repeat offenses result in suspension.

Classroom Environment: Students are asked to maintain a safe learning environment. That can be created by showing simple respect towards one another, refraining from hurtful language and behavior, and keeping distractions to a minimum so that everyone can focus on their learning. Students are expected to be calm and quiet during work time.

Food and Drink Policy: Students should abide by the LHS Student Handbook's guidelines which prohibits energy drinks, candy, large snacks, etc. Students may drink water from a clear water bottle.

Technology: Students must abide by all LPS Technology use guidelines. Students should leave their iPads closed/put away until instructed otherwise. Apple Classroom is a management app that will allow teachers to access student devices - students must allow teacher access during class time. The teacher may take away a student's device at any time during class. Students who have iPads taken away are still expected to complete all online assignments electronically and on time.

Students are expected to bring their devices and charger each day as a large majority of assignments will be done online. Students must also abide by the LHS cell phone rules as well as air pods.

Detention: Students will abide by the rules in the Lexington High School Student handbook including cell phone and iPad rules, and behavior and disciplinary guidelines. Students will also abide by the classroom routines and expectations set by Mr. Con and Mr Waddle. Disciplinary consequences will follow the behavior pyramid {Warning, One-to-One Conference, Detention, Office Referral}. Detentions must be served the day of or the day after or time will double. At 2 hours detention time students will be reported to ISS. The four step behavior pyramid plan will start over at semester.

Safety: Fire - Exit Door #12, Tornado - ISS Room (basement), Lockdown - stay in the classroom, Evacuation - Baptist Church
