The curriculum will focus on the following areas:

- Weekly spelling/vocabulary lists--study affixes and word bases.
- Students will keep and maintain a vocabulary/English notebook.
- Writing genres (including but not limited to): narrative, persuasive, descriptive, argumentative, and expository.
- Students will do an argumentative research paper following MLA formatting guidelines.
- Grammar and Usage.
- Literature: a study of different genres and literature from around the world.
- Trade books (paperback novels).
- Technology will be used to enhance student instruction.

- Semester test/final: 10% of grade.

Class Expectations:
