Overview:

- *Identify a variety of stress causing factors and their effects on human behavior*

Attendance and Participation

Evaluation/Grading

Your overall grade in this course will be based on attendance and participation, class assignments, journals, projects, and assessments. The Grading Scale to be followed will be that which is published in the Lexington High School student handbook. Your grade in this class will be assigned as follows:

15% concept connection/reflection (lead-in, exit ticket-type snapshot assessments)

40% major assessments (projects, tests)

15% quizzes

30% minor assignments (daily work, notes, homework, vocabulary)

No extra credit will be given.

Semester Grade will be based on the following criteria:

Quarter 1 = 45% / Quarter 2 = 45% / *1st Semester Exam = 10%

Quarter 3 = 45% / Quarter 4 = 45% / *2nd Semester Exam = 10%

***Please note: the final semester exam (both semesters) will count for 10% of the final semester grade each semester – as per LHS policy.**
