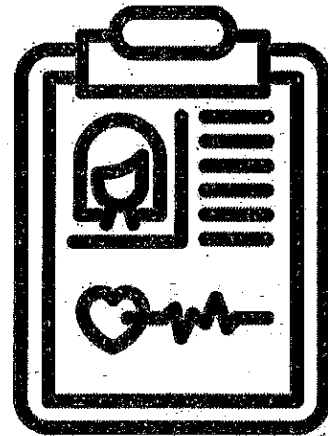

## Welcome

to Health Science II



Health Science II is designed to provide students a more in-depth exploration of personal interests within healthcare as well as a deeper analysis of the healthcare system overall. The course will include demonstrating workplace skills in a health science professional setting or educational facility. Instruction includes health literacy, introduction to organization of the body, medical terminology and medical math, analysis, and application of emergency and technical skills, as well as a deeper analysis of legal and ethical issues within healthcare.

### Expectations

-  Be on time (If you need to use the restroom, check in first or you will have a detention)

ie. ask for help or ideas, Stay focused during work time given. The grade you receive is a direct reflection of your effort.

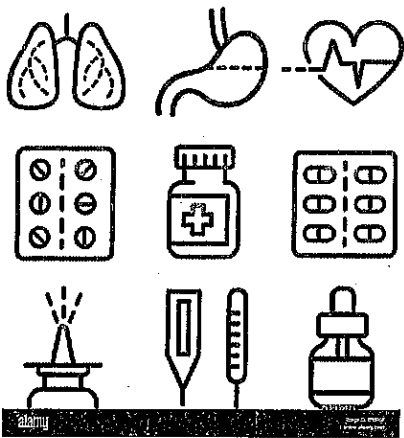
Cell phones and headphones are to be left out in the hall with you backpacks.

**Communication is Key**

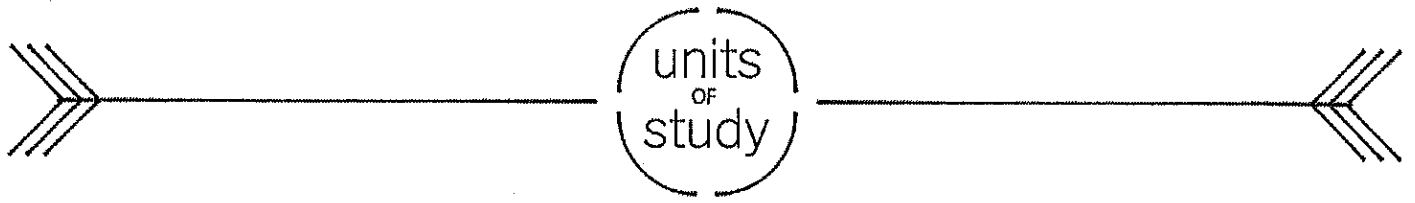
*Do I lose points for late work?*
