Course Description:

Welcome to Drama! This course is designed to immerse English Language Learners in the exciting world of drama while enhancing their language skills. Through engaging activities, improvisations, and performances, students will build confidence in their English speaking and listening abilities, improve their vocabulary, and develop an appreciation for the arts. By participating in drama, students will gain practical experience in using English in various contexts, from scripted dialogues to spontaneous conversations.

Course Objectives:

Language Development: Expand vocabulary and improve grammar through interactive and expressive activities.

Communication Skills: Enhance speaking, listening, and non-verbal communication skills in a supportive environment.

Cultural Understanding: Explore and appreciate diverse cultural expressions and storytelling traditions.

Confidence Building: Increase self-assurance in using English through performance and collaborative projects.

Creative Expression: Foster creativity and imagination through improvisation and scripted performances.

Course Structure:

Warm-Up Activities: Start each class with exercises to relax and prepare for creative work, focusing on physical and vocal warm-ups.

Language Practice: Engage in activities designed to practice new vocabulary and phrases within the context of drama.

Improvisation: Participate in improvisational games and exercises to encourage spontaneous language use and creative thinking.

Grading

Grading will be categorized in three main areas: engagement, minor work, and major work

Daily Work – 15%

1. An absence is the loss of 5 points.
2. Non-participation in class discussion or group work will result in the loss of up to 4 points per day.
3. Misbehavior and disrespect will result in the loss of up to 4 points per day
4. Leaving necessary materials, laptop, or books at home, in a car or a locker will result in the loss of up to 4 points per day. Lanyards should be around the neck when the student enters the room.
5. No gum or candy in the mouth during class.
6. After an absence, points can be made up by reading a short play, performing an improvisation, or performing “extra” scene or monologue work.

Minor Work/ Homework – 35%

Assignments include homework, vocabulary work, class notes, including those on reading, play production or scene work, reflective and response writing, and an occasional quiz. Students should keep all papers – handouts, notes, and graded work – until the end of the semester. Students are required to attend either the fall one-act or a UNK theater production and write a critique about the performance and experience.

Major Work/ Performance/ Presentations – 50%

Unit or final tests will have writing segments. Essays, critiques, and presentations such as memorized monologues and scene work also fall into this category. Assigned project work, either by individual or by group, will be graded and may include memorized scene work. There will be a final exam at the end of the semester (December 19-20) so plan ahead.

“Semester Test” Grade (will count 10% per semester)

- Q1 Grades + Q2 Grades = 90% of the First Semester Grade; Semester Test = 10%
- Q3 Grades + Q4 Grades = 90% of the Second Semester Grade; Semester Test = 10%
