Course Objectives: The course objective will be to help you develop an awareness of French and Francophone cultures and to explore and develop skills in listening comprehension, oral and written communication, and reading comprehension; to learn how French functions as a language through the study of a variety of activities designed to help you acquire basic grammatical structure and vocabulary, and to understand the relationship between sounds and spellings of French. You will be encouraged to develop imaginative thought and personal and intellectual growth. You will also be encouraged to develop the skills to become responsible students and life-long learners.

Expectations:

- 1. Respect yourself.** Be honest. Do your best at all times and work hard. Keep good, organized notes! Cheating and plagiarism are unacceptable and will result in a zero score. Late work will receive a maximum score of 50%. Sleeping in class is not acceptable and may result in disciplinary action.

Note-taking: Students are expected to take hand-written notes in class, unless otherwise instructed. Studies show that writing by hand helps with memory in language learning!

Missing Class/Late Work: If a student is absent from class, the student is expected to make the assignment up within two (2) days of their return. Late work will receive a maximum of 50% credit. Cheating and plagiarism will result in a zero score.

Restroom Policy: Students may not use the restroom during instructional time, except in cases of an emergency.

Testing: All tests and projects that are not finished in class **must** be completed the day that they are taken/due after school.

Cell phones/earbuds/headphones are not to be used at any point during class.
