Course Syllabus

Instructor: Mr. Galvan

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Course Description: This course will be an introduction to Economics and Financial Literacy. The first portion of the course will cover learning about economic systems and theories, and the interworking of the capitalistic market. The second portion will develop financial literacy using Dave Ramsey's material. Students will learn how to: 1) create a budget, 2) save money, 3) pay off debt, and 4) invest for the future. Throughout the course, students will have the opportunity to practice skills through interactive exercises and real-world scenarios.

Course Objectives:

- 1) Explain the basic foundations of Micro and Macro Economics.
- 2) Explain the different Economic Systems and Theories.
- 3) Explain how Supply and Demand work.
- 4) Explain and apply basic methods to save and budget their finances.
- 5) Explain and understand the purpose of credit and the dangers of debt.
- 6) Explain the role of taxes and choosing the right carrier.

Grading Policy:

Summative (Tests, Papers, Projects, Quizzes): 60% of Grade

Formative (Homework, Classwork): 40% of Grade

Artificial Intelligence: The use of artificial intelligence to write papers and submit them as your own is a violation of school policy. Everything you turn in for a grade should reflect your own individual thoughts and work. If found to have used and flagged for AI detection software, the student will have to redo the assignment or part of the assignment in order to receive any degree of credit, up to the instructor's discretion. Multiple violations or abuse of this policy may result in further disciplinary action.

General Guidelines:

1. Come to class prepared (charged iPad, positive attitude, etc.)
2. If you are tardy, you will serve a detention of 15 minutes after school.
